

Host mother said that about ten years ago, there were various country's shops, but now most of them changed to Chinese.












Secondly, zoos educate people about animals. Most children love animals and learn about them at school. Zoos provide a place where children can experience the animals first hand, rather than just seeing pictures of them in books, which leads to a better understanding. In addition, zoos teach the public about the dangers to animals and ways to help them. For instance, endangered species, such as the Indonesian orangutan, are kept in zoos. There are signs at the zoo that tell us what factors are harming the species. As a result of the knowledge that the orangutan's habitant is being destroyed to make palm oil plantations, many people have stopped using products containing this oil.
